Please join us on Monday, March 5, for an exciting program on the recent discovery of Eocene pollen underlying Pine Island, presented by Curtis Klug. Dr. Klug is a geologist, and was formerly with Cardno Entrix, the company that oversaw the drilling of the 919 meter well for the Greater Pine Island Water Association, in which the pollen was discovered... Dr. Klug is co-author with Dr. David Jarzen, formerly of the Florida Museum of Natural History, in this study of the pollen that has led to a new understanding of the State of Florida's geologic history, showing emergent land existed in the State 10-15 million years older than previously believed. In the epoch called the Eocene, when hoofed carnivores dashed across North America and four-legged whales swam the Atlantic, flowers apparently bloomed

Southwest Florida on at least one island in the location of our own Pine Island.

Dr. King will discuss the process and the impact of the discovery on previous beliefs regarding the existence of animal and plant life and sea level changes of Pine Island. Please mark your calendars for this most interesting and unique presentation.
