MARCH 3, 2014 Roy Kibbe, owner of Jug Creek Seafood Farm Raised Clams, will present a program on his early life on Pine Island and his eventual ownership of a major blue crab business and Jug Creek Seafood. Jug Creek Seafood had been at one time the largest producer of farm raised clams in the State of Florida.

Have you ever seen a seed clam? They are so small you can hold one million of them in your hand. Kibbe will show different stages of clam growth. He will provide a unique insight into the impact of adverse environmental conditions, both natural and man-made, on his water dependent industry.


ATTENTION VOLUNTEERS......
